MARITIME TRIVIA QUESTION FOR TODAY

What are sailors talking about when they say they are going to bream their ship?

Previous Question

- A. In the days of sailing ships men of war used to carry many iron cannon balls. To keep the balls from rolling around they were put in special racks with holes that were slightly smaller than the cannon ball. These racks were made out of brass instead of iron so the iron balls could not rust to the racks. These racks were known as brass monkeys.
- B. Whenever it was very cold the brass would contract at a faster rate than the iron and literally pop the cannon balls out of the brass monkey. Hence sailors coined the phrase cold enough to freeze the balls off a brass monkey to mean that it was extremely cold.
