WEATHER FORECAST

High pressure continues to be the predominant weather feature. Winds will continue to come from the East at 20 kts or less. Seas and swells will be 8 feet or less coming from the East, with a slight secondary swell out of the Southeast. Cloud cover will consist of cirrus blowing off the tops of thunderstorms to the south of us along with scattered cumulus and towering cumulus clouds with a fair chance of squalls/showers. Sea temp is 82 on its way to 86 for Saipan. Wake Island is forecasting a high of 89 and a low of 79. On our leg from Wake to Saipan will likely see an increase in squalls/ thunderstorms.
