## WEATHER FORECAST

Current satellite animation shows an area of thunderstorms and showers associated with a tropical wave 300 NM West of our vessels' current route. Expect current weather conditions to continue for the next 24 hours with continued squalls and thunderstorms. Primary swells will be from the East, with secondary swells from the SE. Easterly winds veering to SE at 20 kts or less, seas 8 ft. or less, and sea surface temp 82 degrees F. With any luck the tropical wave will outrun us and we will be back in fair weather for celestial navigation.
